

#### Minister's Letter

Thank you so much for your warm welcome into the Shelswell Benefice. As you probably know, my start here was severely disrupted by crashing my bike crossing the "Bainton Splash". As advised by a physiotherapist, that will be the last time I try to ford a stream on two wheels! The accident forced me into six weeks of convalescence, that coincided with Lent, the period when we reflect on the time Jesus spent in the wilderness following his baptism by John, and before starting his ministry in Galilee:

At once the Spirit sent him out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him.

Mark 1:12-13

Jesus needed to spend time away from the world, preparing for what was going to be an intense time of travelling, teaching, and healing. Regular "retreats" also became an integral part of his life pattern during his three years in Northern Israel.

At times my time at home did feel like being in the wilderness. In such circumstances it can be tempting to despair. But I was looked after by a loving wife, and many kind friends came to visit me – I certainly felt like I was attended by angels and not wild beasts! And I rapidly came to appreciate this new-found space in my life, space to relax (listening to my music back-catalogue!), sit in God's presence and reflect on what's next.

Isn't that something we all need to do? Modern life is that hectic, with so many priorities conflicting with each other, sometimes it can be hard to know how to plan or prepare for the future. Don't many of us feel over-faced, dissatisfied, and stressed out?

Perhaps surprisingly, the solution to this can be the opposite of what you might expect – rather than frantically dividing our time between planning and action, to take time out to rest, recharge our batteries and spend time with God. Those who do this regularly often find they have renewed energy, clarity of vision and motivation to get important things done.

Traditionally, Lent is a time of self-denial and reflection. But as that season comes to an end and we enter Easter, why not take forward a desire to create space in our lives to be kind to ourselves, that we might better love our neighbours?

#### **Public Switched Telephone Network withdrawal**

Between now and 2025, most telephone providers such as BT, O2 or Virgin Media will be moving their customers from old analogue landlines to digital telephone services in preparation for taking the old telephone lines out of service. This means that landline services provided by home phones and some healthcare devices will no longer work and may need to be changed. For most people, the change is likely to be simply plugging the phone into a broadband router rather than the socket on the wall.

The old public switched telephone network does not require an electricity supply for a basic phone service, and its phone service is independent of both the electricity networks and the internet. Under the new arrangements, normal landline telephones will be connected to the internet, and will get a digital phone service via the internet.

Internet telephony has been in use without problems for some years, with phones being plugged into a broadband router, and many people are already using internet telephony for their landline phones. However, it is important to note that it does require an electricity supply to power the router and is therefore vulnerable to power cuts.

For most residents, the change will be straightforward and telephone providers will advise their customers directly. It may be more involved if for example a customer

- depends on the phone and does not have a back up mobile in case of a power cut
- does not already have broadband internet
- has another telephone service-dependent device, for example a personal alarm or a healthcare device





Some of the ones of note included Bergenia 'Baby Doll' for a shady corner giving lovely pink flowers from April to May, Brunnera 'Hadspen Cream' has lovely cream variegation with small numerous blue flowers, loved by bees and pollinators. For a sunny border Erodium 'Spanish Eyes' has pink flowers and will flower if the soil is free draining.

Don told us about the best garden in Yorkshire - Breezy Knees - and the Plant Fair he runs in early May where he sells many of the plants he grows in his garden. This could be worth an outing.

Climate Change and how it effects our gardens. Lucy firstly highlighted the aspects of climate change including how the carbon cycle and water cycle work and are now changing. She showed impressive global maps indicating the increase in temperature from the 1950s to 2020s. Lucy suggested several actions for us as gardeners to enable us to adapt to the effects of climate change and increase the resilience of our gardens. Her two most important actions were to retain a patch of grass to grow wildflowers and to keep old/dead sticks, tree branches etc. and pile in a shady corner for wildlife and micro-organisms to thrive replenishing our soil and increasing biodiversity. Other suggestions were: - only use peat free compost, divide properties using hedges rather than fences (and after pruning, tuck the debris under the bottom of the hedge to decay and rot back into the soil (or possibly provide nesting areas for hedgehogs), avoid paving large areas and using pesticides, weed manually, grow plenty of pollinators, buy bare root plants and seeds, grow a green roof or even install solar panels. To keep our gardens growing we need to "embrace the concept of change".

On April 9th we will welcome Rob Jacobs who will talk about Behind the scenes at Waterperry Gardens.

Club membership fee is now £15 per year. This covers all speakers, zoom meetings in January and February as well as entry to the evening garden visits. The visitor fee is now £5, which will be refunded if the visitor decides to join the Club that evening. #### SHELSWELL POETRY APPRECIATION GROUP

Our theme for March was Stars. One of the most emotionally affecting poems, although not a sentimental one, was *Drummer Hodge* by Thomas Hardy. Set during the Boer War, it is about an earlier incarnation of Tommy Atkins dying and being buried in South Africa, where 'strange-eyed constellations' rule the sky above his grave. In the 1914-18 war, Julian Grenfell wrote *Into Battle* and saw the stars above the trenches as the soldiers' companions. The current conflict in Palestine and the horror of child casualties is the theme of *Starry Night Over Gaza* by Fatima Said. The National Anthem of America, *The Star-Spangled Banner*, by Francis Scott Key reminds us that, in the War of 1812, it was a symbol of victory over an enemy, and that each star represents a state.

Human stars - Marilyn Monroe and Vincent Van Gogh – and their tragic deaths, are the subjects in *Death of Marilyn Monroe* by Sharon Olds and *Starry Starry Night* by Maria Williams.

Winter Stars by Larry Levis describes a man in a troubled relationship with his father finding comfort in gazing up at the night sky. In Sonnet 14 William Shakespeare links his lover's eyes with the stars whilst decrying the then-popular craze for astrology. In The Sun Rising John Donne scolds the sun, (which is a star!) for intruding on a happy relationship, and in Orion Adrienne Rich describes her bond with that constellation, whilst Sara Teasdale makes that same constellation a comforting and stable part of her world. William Barnes, on the other hand, in A Winter Night, gets no comfort from the stars in his isolation. Gerard Manley Hopkins exults in the beauty of the stars, which he links with Christ and his mother in The Starlight Night.

Poems which show the poet thinking deeply about the stars are *The Sun of the First Day* by Rabindranath Tagore, *To the Evening Star* by William Blake, *The Twelfth Night Star* by Bliss Carman, *The Star Sirius* by George Meredith, *Getting at Stars* by Simon Armitage and *On Looking Up by Chance at the Constellations* by Robert Frost. Other poems we read which ponder the subject of what the stars mean to humans are *Stars* by Emily Bronte, *Looking up at the Starry Sky Above Hargai* by Xi Chuan, *There are Stars* by Hannah Szenes and *Falling Star* by Masayo Koike. In *When I Heard the Learned Astronomer*, Walt Whitman prefers to just look at the stars rather than hearing scientific facts about them.

Finally, two poems for children which will be familiar to many are the anonymous *Star Wish* and *Twinkle*, *Twinkle*, *Little Star* by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century writer Jane Taylor.





#### **Defibrillator**

A defibrillator is now installed in the porch of St Edmund & St George Church. It is ready for use in an emergency. The following advice is from the British Heart Foundation:

- A defibrillator is a device that gives a jolt of energy to the heart. It helps get the heart beating again when someone is in cardiac arrest and their heart has stopped.
- Anyone can use a defibrillator. You do not need training. Once you turn it on, it will give clear step-by-step voice instructions. Many defibrillators also have visual prompts and images showing how to use it.



• The device checks the person's heart rhythm and will only tell you to give them a shock if it's needed. You cannot shock yourself or someone else accidentally.

To get access to the defibrillator, Dial 999 and give your location – i.e. St Edmund & St George Church, Hethe, OX27 8ES. The emergency call handler will give you an access code to open the cabinet. Press the green button to switch on the defibrillator and follow the instructions.

CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) training is being arranged by the Parish Council for anyone who wishes to learn more.

#### MESSAGE FROM SWALLOWS NURSERY

Dear Villagers,

Those of you who have visited us in recent months will have seen the continuing development at Swallows Nursery. We just wanted to update you on our current plans.

Firstly, we are expanding the number of plants we grow here at the Nursery, and we are pleased to say that this year we will be doubling our production of herbaceous perennials. We have placed two poly tunnels in the middle field for this purpose.

Other developments include moving our tree area into the middle field so that our customers can better see the range of trees that we have on offer. The trees will be supported by posts and lines, and are irrigated. We also have a new bare root section for hedging.

A lot of work has been done on the overgrown areas around the Nursery: Paul has kindly cut our beech hedge along the drive and car park with his tractor and flail, and we have called in arborists to do major trims of all other hedging around the Nursery.

You may well have noticed that we created a much larger car park last year. Further to this, we are expanding the car park again to ensure that we have good capacity for both cars and a bigger range of composts.

Our Show Gardens have been very popular with our customers, and we have plans for a new 'Retro' garden themed on 1970s and 1980s gardens, as well as an alpine garden using recycled horticultural machine parts... oh....and we are getting a real 250 year old cannon! All of this we hope will add interest to your visits.

We are in the process of updating the main barn to enable us to sell fertilizers, more composts and plant and pot related gardening essentials. However, we have no plans to sell other items, such as scented candles, as we do not plan on becoming a garden centre!

Those of you who have experienced our organic coffee will also know that we offer cakes but, again, we have no plans to offer chips any time soon!

Thank you for supporting us in finding accommodation for our co-worker from Ukraine.

Finally, I would welcome any questions that villagers may have regarding developments at the Nursery and look forward to seeing you soon.

#### Obituary JEAN ALAN WARD (JIM) 1932 - 2024

Uncle Jim was born in Mixbury, along with his sister Mary, my mother. They lived with their mum and dad, John and Ruth, who for many decades kept the shop and post office.

Ruth was also born in the village, one of 12 surviving children born to Charles Chatwell. originally of Farthinghoe, Charles came to the village in the late 1800s to be gardener at the Rectory, and was later sexton and church warden. He died aged 86 and Jim would often relate how with failing sight, he was his "grandad's eyes", especially in the garden.

Charles' wife Mary originally came from Shalstone and died aged 39, worn out by so many pregnancies and trying to feed such a large family.

As a young boy Jim was tasked with helping in the church and carrying buckets of coke to try and heat the building for services.

He cycled to school in Brackley and, failing his exams for Magdalen, was not impressed when his father decided to pay

towards his grammar school education. He always said he derived no benefit from it and was happy to leave and go to his first job, which was in a garage.

He did all the cleaning up jobs and filling cars with petrol and oil changes etc but swiftly became interested in mechanical work.

Although he should have done a spell of National Service due to his age, family legend suggests he didn't because he had flat feet and they didn't need him that badly!




His best friend from childhood, Keith Merritt, should have been best man when Jim married Audrey, aged 20 and 23 respectively, but Keith was doing his National Service overseas and couldn't oblige.

After marrying they were able to rent the bungalow at the crossroads of the Buckingham Road and Featherbed Lane and eventually he got a job with Mr Hull's garage at Finmere where they sold new cars and also did repair work..

After a time Jim earned more money by moving to the Army base at Bicester, where he worked on converting some surplus vehicles from WW2 for the expanding market in road haulage.

He spent several years in the early 1960's at Croughton base working with the USAF and received letters of commendation from the base commander for being able to turn his hand to any tasks required, training others and also being a skilled engine fitter. It was quite an interesting time to be involved with our most powerful allies and the height of the Cold War. Incidentally his father was involved with the civil emergency at the time and I remember the siren fitted to the wall in the post office.



The later sixties was probably when Jim got his own lorry and was contracted to collect and deliver loads around the area. He visited many farms and knew quite a lot of the farmers and with house building booming, he delivered many loads of bricks from Arncott.

Latterly he worked at Finmere Mill for Midland Shires Farmers, again delivering animal feed stuff. He told me they came to him and said "you finish work at 12.00 on Wednesday". It was his 65th birthday.

With plenty of spare time, even with quite a large garden and his parents to care for, he began working at Buckingham Garden Centre which he enjoyed. Later on he went to help Angela and Ben Collins at the Rectory and said he always seemed to be digging out ground elder. How ironic that 80 years earlier his grandfather was doing a similar job.

Losing his wife Audrey in 2017, after over 60 years of marriage, was tough. He missed her dreadfully having cared for her lovingly because of her arthritis.

Several years ago Jim had a mishap in his car and the police got in touch with the family and we realised that he needed some help. I was able to retire early and moved up in October 2022 to look after him, as it was felt he was not safe on his own..

He enjoyed going out in the car and looking around the lanes of his childhood and he still enjoyed his garden. He was a delight to know and made many new friends in that time as they came to see him and make his life easier, so that he could stay at home.

Many people soon felt as if they had known him a long time; he was so easy to get on with. He was a rather lovely chap.

#### Cathedral Attendance Up Strongly in 2022

Attendance at Church of England cathedrals bounced back following the lockdown closures, according to recently released statistics for 2022.

Figures show that adult usual Sunday attendance rose 60% between 2021 and 2022 for the forty two Church of England mainland Cathedrals. A total of 28,200 people including children attended Sunday services every week, according to Cathedral Statistics 2022.

In addition, there were also 584,000 attendances at 2,100 specially arranged services over the year, such as school services. The total reported attendance at Christmas services in our cathedrals for 2022 stood at 104,000.















