


Not just for Whitsun

Very occasionally, you may still hear people talking about the Spring Bank Holiday as the 'Whitsun' break. Until 1965, this national holiday took place on the Monday after Pentecost; but the inconvenience of its date, always 50 days after the moveable feast of Easter, finally argued for its replacement with a fixed 'day off'. Our inherited cultural calendar understood the intimate connection between these two great feasts, which share an almost equal weight in the cycle of the Christian year.

Easter proclaims the resurrection of Christ from the grave, the transformation of humanity into something glorious after its passage through pain and death. It celebrates something fundamentally mysterious, defying explanation. The disciples are confounded by the risen Christ when they encounter him: as the gardener, the companion on the journey to Emmaus, or the stranger on the shoreline. Jesus is almost unrecognisable - until their eyes are opened, and they begin, fragmentarily, to understand. The risen Lord is no revived corpse. He is the flickering image of the human future, cast into the shadowy present of his friends for them to behold.

Fifty days after the resurrection, the disciples wait in the Upper Room. In the calendar of the Old Covenant, it is the Feast of Weeks, Shavuot, commemorating the gift of the Law on Sinai. The disciples hear the wind and behold the flames, and then find they are able to speak and be understood by many as they are filled by



the Holy Spirit. They receive something far greater than the Law this Pentecost because God himself comes to inhabit them. He comes as the advocate, source of consolation and giver of gifts, who will speak the truth through them to all who will hear. He comes as love to dwell in their hearts, making sense of the mystery of the Christ they have encountered, and enabling them to share that mystery with others. Pentecost gives the disciples all they need to pass on what they have received from the Lord, so that others too may believe, and be transformed.

The gift of Pentecost is not just for Whitsun. It flickers in every natural gift and skill we possess. It rises to a flame in Baptism, in the sharing of the Eucharist and the life of Christian discipleship. To us it gives the ability, and the boldness, to pass on what we have received, and to live faithfully and lovingly in hope of the glory which is to come.

Funeral Jean Diana Elizabeth Tingey 10th February 1953 to 2nd March 2024





SHELSWELL GARDEN CLUB



On **April 9th** Rob Jacobs came to talk about '**Behind the scenes at Waterperry Gardens**'. His role he says is to 'manage all the processes.' Rob told us about the history of Waterperry. Interestingly it was an early supporter of women in horticulture, many of whom trained there and still do. They have exhibited frequently at the Chelsea Flower Show and won a number of medals. He described activities monthly through the year with lovely illustrations. Notably the lifting and dividing of their large perennial border during March which provides endless colour from May to August. In August and September apples are picked and they make around 30,000 bottles of apple juice per year.

On **May 14th** we are going for a **social evening** with a look around the garden of a member of the club and a plant swop. This is an evening for **members only**.

June 11th provides our second evening visit to a local garden, set in beautiful countryside. This evening is for **members only**.

In **July** we have our Summer Outing, to confirmed. Details to follow.

Our autumn evening visit (10th September) is to The Grange, Chalgrove, (NGS garden) 11 acres of gardens including herbaceous borders and a large expanse of prairie with many grasses and a wildflower meadow. There is a lake with bridges and a planted island, a dry riverbed and a labyrinth. The characters of Sam and Sadie were believable, as was their on/off relationship and their journey though their teenage years to late twenties. Some particular parts were loved – Marx's coma, the game created by Sam to connect with Sadie (and how that felt you were 'inside the game'...) SHELSWELL POETRY APPRECIATION GROUP

At our April meeting we looked at a selection of poems about Fruit. We began with a classic – Keats's **Ode to Autumn**, with its hypnotic evocation of warmth and fertility; we went on to Eugenio de Andrade's **Fruit**, which glories in the sensuous appeal of fruit, through its scent, taste and evocative names. Pablo Neruda, in **A Lemon** finds the same delight in the subject, as does **O taste and See** by Denise Levertov.

In **Strawberries** by Edwin Morgan, the fruit he writes about is associated with love and happy memories, and in The Orange, being in love makes even an everyday fruit special. In Gary Soto's **Oranges**, he expresses a fond nostalgia for a time when, taking a girl out for the first time (at the age of twelve!) he bartered an orange for chocolate as a gift for her.

Darker notes were introduced in **The Pomegranate**, by Eavan Boland, when she compares her relationship with her daughter with that between Ceres and Proserpine, and by **Strange Fruit**, written by Lewis Allen and turned into an iconic song by Billie Holliday – a song in which the fruits hanging from the poplar trees are the bodies of lynched men – 'a strange and bitter crop'.

Fruits of late summer and early autumn are celebrated in **Blackberries** – **for Jo**, by Katrina Porteous and **Blackberry Picking** by Seamus Heaney, both raising memories of childhood harvesting. In **Apples** by Laurie Lee, the author of 'Cider with Rosie' celebrates the fruit in all its manifestations and Robert Frost describes the hard work of getting in the fruit in **After Apple-Picking** and its place in the turning of the seasons on his farm in Vermont.

In **Summer Shower** by Emily Dickinson, rain enhances the orchard, but in **Goblin Market** by Christina Rossetti fruit in all its bounty is a sinister metaphor for drug addiction and is thought to be the poet's comment on the hold that medicines such as laudanum had on so many Victorian women. The complete poem is long, and we just looked at the list of thirty fruits offered to young girls by the goblins to tempt and enslave them. Dark stuff for a poem originally written by Rossetti for children!

Fringford Rectors 1756-1898 This is the first of a three part series on Fringford Rectors by Martin Greenwood

The parish was particularly fortunate in its rectors from 1756, starting with the wealthy John Russell Greenhill (1756-1813). From 1814 to 1894, the parish benefited enormously from the personal wealth, intellectual ability and social standing of three 'regal rectors': Henry Roundell (1814-52), Henry De Salis (1852-73) and Cadwallader Coker (1873-94). The church was largely rebuilt in this period. The attractions of such a small rural parish are not immediately obvious. However, the Crown had taken over the advowson (the right to present the rector) in 1766 and by 1817 the annual tithes and stipends were some £431 (£37, 750 today). In Fritwell by comparison, the vicars received less than £120 (£10,430 today). After these four wealthy rectors came the humble but popular Charles Thompson.

The Revd John Russell Greenhill (1756-1813)

Greenhill was a cousin of the Russell family, who were descended from Oliver Cromwell and owned Chequers before it was given to the nation in 1912 for the use of our Prime Ministers. Greenhill himself had a large estate at Ellesborough, near Chequers. He was appointed rector in 1756 but was non-resident in Croydon with Charles Cotton his curate at least from 1764-66. From 1767-73 he lived in Finmere, before moving to Cottisford in 1773, where he leased Cottisford House from Eton College for a very extravagant price, £7,300 (£1.56 million today). The Fringford rectory was 'a mere thatched cottage, too small for his family'.

In 1779, he also became rector of Marsh Gibbon. Two of his manuscript diaries survive, covering the years 1780-87 and 1793-1800. They include his daily engagements and meticulous weather observations. These and other records show him to have been very social but also unusually conscientious in a period when there were many absentee and pluralist parsons who never visited their parishes. The diaries also give the reader an interesting insight into the daily life of an 18th-century parson in the 1780s and 1790s.

There seems to have been a set pattern of services in Fringford by the 1780s & 1790s, with 2 services on Sunday, a sermon in the morning, and communion services six times a year. In the 1790s, the morning congregation ranged from 45 to 72 and the number of communicants form 9 to 27. These are good figures by comparison with other local villages and Greenhill found them 'in general very good frequenters of the church.'

In 1796, 'an illness affected my voice in such a manner as to render me unable to read aloud ever since. 'I engaged with Mr Breeks to assist me and I am now fitting up my parsonage house for him, which I give him with the garden & £40 a year & surplice fees (wh. are trifling). I attend my own Ch. as regularly as when I did the duty myself- & the attendance on the sick I take entirely on myself.' 'In the Visitation Return of 1802, there were 'about 42 families and about 225 souls.'

In 1768, a small school was started by Dr Addington & Greenhill, teaching the catechism, reading and writing. In 1802 'A school is maintained for the instruction of youth of both sexes, in religion & reading, by the Chan'r of the Exchequer & myself jointly.' (i.e. Henry Addington, Prime Minister and Chancellor 1801-4). In 1808, a Dame school was supported by parental payments, except for 8 children paid for by Lord Sidmouth (formerly Henry Addington) and the Rector. In 1813, Greenhill died and was buried in the cenotaph at Ellesborough, Bucks. His only son, Sir Robert (1762-1836), was MP for Thirsk from 1807-31 and he was created Baron in 1832. He was also buried at Ellesborough.

WASTE RECYCLING CENTRES EXTENDED OPEN HOURS

Oxfordshire is to increase its recycling service to residents by extending the opening hours at all seven of its Household Waste Recycling Centres from next week.

The extended service will mean that from Tuesday 26th May, the centres at Alkerton, Ardley, Dix Pit, Drayton, Oakley Wood, Redbridge and Stanford in the Vale will now open at 8 am and close at the later time of 5 pm. This applies seven days a week. Please note the current 4 pm closing time is still applicable across the Bank Holiday weekends.

Please note that late-night opening on Thursdays and the acceptance of trailers and hire vans remains suspended for the time being. The revised service comes as Oxfordshire County Council continues its recovery phase from the COVID-19 emergency.

FOOTPATH UPDATE

Mixbury to Evenley footpath is walkable again! Thanks to a local Oxfordshire volunteer team and support from the landowners, the 303/1 footpath is clear and usable again. For anyone not familiar with this route it starts at the bus stop in Mixbury and passes down the side of the garage of the house at the end of the gravel track. From there it passes diagonally to the right across a paddock, over two stiles, continuing diagonally across two fields (in which there are two more stiles to cross a small stream), keeping to the left of the barns. At the far side you exit over another stile from where you can cross the road and continue a traffic free walk to Evenley passing by Evenley Wood Gardens. (Information from Amanda French). NB. Please take care when crossing fields with livestock and keep dogs on leads.

19th May – Dunstan: the abbot who restored monastic life in England

Dunstan (909-988 AD) stands out as an example of what just one person can achieve when they follow the call of God on their life.


Dunstan was born near Glastonbury, of a noble family with royal connections and church connections; his uncle was Archbishop of Canterbury. But in 935, at the age of 26, he was accused of 'studying the vain poems of the pagans' – and expelled from court. He nearly married, but instead made private monastic vows and was ordained a priest by Elphege, bishop of Winchester.


Dunstan began his priestly life by simply returning to Glastonbury and living as a hermit. He painted, embroidered and did metalwork. But when in 939 Edmund became king of Wessex, he recalled Dunstan and made him abbot of Glastonbury. The monastic life of the country was all but dead; the Danish invasions and the hostility of local magnates had seen to that. Dunstan set out to change all this, and went on to restore monastic life in England, under the Rule of St Benedict.


Down the years, Dunstan saw kings come and go: Edmund, Edred, Edgar, Edward. Under King Edgar Dunstan was made bishop of Worcester in 957, bishop of London in 959, and Archbishop of Canterbury in 960. Thus was born a fruitful collaboration between King and Archbishop which was to reform the Church in England. Monastic orders began to thrive once more. After the Conquest, the days of Dunstan would be looked back on as the 'golden age'.


Dunstan was zealous for the faith. He taught, prayed, fasted, repaired churches, acted as judge, inspired national laws of the land, made sure taxes were paid, and encouraged his monks in their manuscripts and prayers. He remained active right to the end of his life: he preached three times on Ascension Day 988, and died two days later, on 19 May, aged nearly 80. They wrote of him: he was without doubt "chief of all the saints who rest at Christ Church" (Canterbury). It has been well said that the 10th century gave shape to English history, and Dunstan gave shape to the 10th century.








DailyHope is on the line – again!

A free telephone line that provides spiritual support for older people has been relaunched. DailyHope offers music, prayers and reflections from the Church of England at the end of the phone.

While the internet and the telephone cannot replace gathering in person, the telephone line is helpful to many people who are unable to get out and about, either in the long term, or temporarily due to sickness or medical treatment. It was launched during the Covid pandemic, and temporarily suspended earlier this year due to lack of funding.

Now that additional funding has been secured, DailyHope has been relaunched with a drive to find new content and content-providers.

Broadcaster Pam Rhodes, an ambassador for Faith in Later Life, said: "DailyHope has brought Christian fellowship through the landline into the homes of so many, filling their hearts and souls with God's presence and comfort through word, prayer and song.

"It's no wonder that DailyHope has remained so popular – and the thought that this vital service may have been lost to those who value and rely upon it brought real despair. But now, we're thankful to God that DailyHope has been saved. This is wonderful news."





Here are some real-life stories from across the world to show how Christians are helping the most vulnerable in society with God's love.


